New national COVID guidelines

Yesterday the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care issued new national guidelines for the general public and for school settings. The updates guidance will advise:

- Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a
 high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid
 contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal
 activities and they no longer have a high temperature.
- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people.
 They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious.
- For children and young people aged 18 and under with a positive COVID-19 test result, the advice will be to isolate and avoid contact with others for 3 days when most infectious.

Free COVID-19 tests will continue to be available for specific groups, including eligible patients and NHS staff, once the universal testing offer ends on Friday 1 April. Testing is no longer advised in school settings, unless there is a specific directive from the UKHSA.

Year 6 SATs meeting—On Tuesday 5th April at 3.30pm we will hold a short information session about the Year 6 SAT tests. This will tell parents about the structure of the week, and how scores are worked out and when the results return into school. It is also a chance to ask any questions.
