Look out for a letter coming home with regards to some changes we are making about the maths homework we are setting. We are having a huge focus in school on **maths FLUENCY**—how quickly children recall basic number facts—pairs to 10, 20, 100; multiplication facts; subitising numbers—seeing them quickly (YR / Y1). These are so important to support all maths and without rapid recall the children cannot problem solve.

Homework will be easier for you as parents, as the focus is on repeating and gaining speed—like TTRS. A letter will come home explaining more.
